# Surrey Heath Electoral Review

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England was due to publish its final recommendations for Surrey Heath on 13th June. However, the Commission is carrying out consultation on further limited draft recommendations and has opened a new phase limited to areas of Town and Crawley Hill, Old Dean and St. Pauls which will close on 10th July.

The Commission is satisfied that it has received sufficient evidence to finalise its proposals for the rest of the borough. The final recommendations for the whole of the borough are now due to be published on 29th August 2017. (info from Jill Biden, Bisley Parish Clerk)

A reminder that the current recommendations are that Bisley and West End villages should combine, with three Surrey Heath Borough Councillors, instead of the present two per village. (Editor)

### Surrey's Community Recycling Centres – Public Consultation

Surrey County Council is launching a consultation about possible changes to community recycling centres (CRCs).

The Council very much regrets having to make these proposals. Whilst they create efficiencies, which take into current account patterns of use, they are at the same time a reduction in service that I know is highly valued by our residents.

Continued cuts to funding, rising costs and increasing demand for key services means that the need to find savings has reached unprecedented levels. This year alone we need to make savings of more than £100m – that's about 10% of our overall budget.

### The following changes are proposed:

- Permanent closure of four smaller CRCs Bagshot, Cranleigh, Dorking and Warlingham.
- Ending the free daily allowance of non-household waste.
- Closing CRCs on two weekdays so all sites are open for five days a week.
- Restricting users of vans, trailers and pick-ups to larger CRCs only.
- Ensuring CRCs in Camberley and Farnham are only used by Surrey residents.

For more information, please visit the consultation webpage at www. surreycc.gov.uk/recyclingcentres. The questionnaire will be live from Friday 23 June.

Hard copies will also be available at CRCs and by calling 03456 009 009 or texting 07860 053 456. The consultation closes on Monday 7th August. We are encouraging consultation returns to be made via the above webpage where at all possible for ease of processing.

The consultation responses will be used to inform the final plans which will be agreed by SCC's cabinet this autumn. Your support in encouraging residents to take part in the consultation is appreciated.

Although I understand why these changes will not be welcomed I do firmly believe that they will allow a comprehensive and efficient CRC service to Surrey's residents to be maintained while delivering savings to the taxpayer to help protect essential services.

# Rights of Way maintenance funding reductions

Revenue funding has been reduced in recent years and will be reducing further this year, producing 'significant challenges in meeting statutory duties, ensuring public safety and keeping paths open.'

### Categories and effects of reduced budget on maintenance work:

Vegetation clearance, signing, surface repairs to paths, tree safety work, general maintenance on e.g. gates / stiles and bridges.

### BISLEY VILLAGE HOG ROAST



### Norman S. Fostekew 1944-2017

With sadness we report the death of Parish Councillor Norman Fostekew on 31st May. After retirement, he served the village as a councillor for 6 years, working tirelessly for the village he cared about.

During his working life he was a prison officer and ran his own gardening business. For some years he was contracted by the Council to look after the village green, recreation ground and the playspace, which he did brilliantly.

When he came onto the Council he brought his rich expertise and experience with him and was a constant source of advice and guidance to his fellow councillors, as well as being very involved practically.

As Jill Biden, our Parish Clerk, said in her moving tribute to Norman at his funeral service – he was 'a gentleman and a friend, a loyal and supportive Parish Councillor, serving the community of Bisley, wanting only what was best for the village.' A celebration of Norman's life at Bisley Parish Church on the 14th June was attended by a very large gathering. He will be sadly missed and we offer our sincere condolences to his beloved wife Margaret and family.


### Happy Birthday Bisley W.I.
