Bisley Remembers

Barry Wells. 1933-2021

With sadness we report the death of Barry Wells. Barry was a very prominent and popular figure in Bisley for many years until he and his late wife Joan moved to France. We are indebted to Sue Smith for this tribute:-

"He was Chairman of the Village Hall for 14 years and Joan was Treasurer. Below is a photo of Barry & Joan when he retired as Chairman of the hall. He was instrumental in starting/helping many village groups. Starting the Bowls Club, he helped out at the Eventide Club and The Butts where he often drove the minibus. He was Treasurer of the Day Centre while they were fund raising for the Minibus appeal. He cooked Christmas lunches for a main hall full of

people for many years. He was Chairman of the Youth Club, helped get the Bingo on Fridays, in the Jubilee Hall, was involved with the Strawberry Fayre and was Father Christmas for the Playgroup, for many years. He and Joan also helped to organise many community events with Arthur & Jen Martin at the Village Hall. In addition to helping Barry with a lot of these activities, Joan was also W.I. member." Bisley Base The BASE as we often get referred to, opened in June 2003, offering after school care for Bisley school. Children were where they could explore our outside space, games and activities. The service we offered became very popular, so much so we offered

Holy Trinity children spaces. At first, we used a people carrier to transport the children, but it soon became apparent we needed to expand and bought a minibus to help. We have always put the needs of our families first, ensuring the service we provided catered for all and this meant we needed more space. Consequently we added more toilets and rooms to fulfil this.

During these first few years we grew into a valued and well supported service, enabling parents to go to work in the full knowledge their children were having fun and socialising with all their friends. In April 2018 with 12 hours notice we had our OFSTED inspection and achieved 'outstanding'!

Over the past year things have been tricky with the lockdowns and limited income for some months. We struggled to ensure our service would still be viable for the reopening of schools. We miss our children and families, and The BASE does not seem the same when its so quiet.

Bisley Base Preschool was due to open April 2020 but this was delayed and opened in September. We have had so many lovely comments about the preschool and it is growing each term. We have stayed open this lock down for our families who understand

Len Tamplin 1932-2020

SAVING HEALTH SERVICE

Everyone is doing their best during this pandemic. We applauded the NHS last year, but of course there are many others too who are going the extra mile. Some of you reading this will be helping at our



food bank, checking on neighbours and phoning up the vulnerable and lonely. And the internet has never been so busy. Our current situation of lockdown has prompted a different sort of busyness – online.

But what about prayer ? How do we pray, at such a time as this? What should we pray about?

The Christian belief is that this is God's world, that God shares our concern for all that happens here and calls us to pray for the world: its leaders and its people; its poor and its vulnerable; its needs and its healing. Quite simply, we are those who are asked by Jesus to pray 'your kingdom come on earth, as it is in heaven'.

Census 2021

The census is coming on Sunday 21 March 2021.

By taking part, you can help to inform decisions on services that shape your community, such as healthcare, education and transport. It is important that you fill in your census questionnaire online. It's easy to take part, but if you need a little extra help there are a wide range of support services.

There's language support and accessible census guidance and lots of helpful documents on our website. You can also get help from census staff in the contact centre by phone, in a web chat or on social media. The Office for National Statistics (ONS) will send you a letter in the post with an access code and instructions. You can then complete your census online. Paper questionnaires will be available for those who need them.

If your household circumstances change on Census Day, you can let the ONS know. Remember, if you or anyone you know needs help, there's plenty available. You can contact Emma Albery, Census Engagement Manager for North Surrey by email emma.albery23@field.census.gov.uk.

Bisley and West End Food Bank

During the first lockdown it became apparent that some people in the villages of Bisley & West End were in need of support from food banks. This need has not gone away and may increase.

The nearest food bank is not very close by (Woking, based in Sheerwater) and residents in West End & Bisley do not qualify for the Surrey Heath Food Bank operated by the Besom in Camberley. A Bisley and West End Foodbank has therefore been set up to ensure local needs are catered for as easily as possible.

How does it work? A site base has been provided by the Church to store food and prepare parcels for delivery and a team of 35+ local volunteers is already helping prepare the site, collecting and donating food,

fundraising and preparing parcels for delivery. It is being set up as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, with its own bank account, proper accounting records, a Board of Trustees and a website: www.bisleywestendfoodbank.org

Professionals identify and refer people in need

People in need are identified by key local care professionals such as GPs, Schools, Churches, Health Visitors, Social workers, Councillors, CAB Your Sanctuary and WEBCare. They identify people in crisis and can then refer them to access emergency food by completing a referral form and sending it to referralbisleywestendfoodbank@gmail.com. Access to the food bank is only by referral – there is no self-referral.

Delivery is made from the food bank to doorsteps for three days' emergency food and for a limited period of 3 weeks. Referrals can be renewed thereafter as needed. The food bank cannot make donations of money but can advise on organisations to contact for financial help, including debt advice, eg: Frontline, Emmaus Rd, the Lighthouse and local charities which can provide a speedy response.

Food and money are donated

Schools, churches, businesses and individuals donate non-perishable, in-date food (at least 3 months shelf life) to the food bank. There are food drop off points around both villages, including the Rectory (see the website for full details). Grants are also applied for from local bodies to support the food bank and there is a Just Giving page:

Please contact WEBCare for transport to essential medical appointments. This includes help to get to a vaccination centre. Covid protocols are in place to protect drivers - you must wear a mask and be able to get in and out of a vehicle unaided (walking sticks are fine, but no zimmer frames or wheel chairs which need loading into the car's boot).
