#### 29th Open Forum.

The sheer pleasure of being able to meet face-to-face again was underlined by the amount of informal 'networking' that went on while we enjoyed a cup of tea after the Forum!

#### Our 16th Annual General Meeting

After our 29th Open Forum, we went straight into the 16th Annual General Meeting. The Chairman reported that, despite the restrictions imposed on us by the pandemic, the Association had continued to be as active as possible, with regular Committe meetings on Zoom and frequent intervention in matters concerning Bisley residents.

The Treasurer, Alex Summers presented B.R.A.'s accounts for the year, showing that we're still financially healthy!

The Membership Secretary Ray Colvin summarised our membership position, again urging members to attract further friends and neighbours to join.

The Election of a Committee for 2021/22 then took place – the 'new' committee includes Norman Holden (Chairman), Jim Clarke (Vice Chairman), Alex Summers (Treasurer), Liz Colvin (Secretary), Ray Colvin (Membership Secretary) and Erica Agombar, Chris Bixley, Paul Hollylee and Nicky Rapley.

# Cathy's Story.

In May 2020 Bisley village had great plans for VE Day celebrations and then lockdown happened.

We were encouraged to celebrate on our driveways, so I asked my husband if we could paint a big VE in Union Flag colours on the



front lawn. He agreed as long as we used grass friendly paint, which it absolutely was until I ran out and used gloss. So, it was there for about three months.

Then came the news that due to Covid restrictions everyone was being told not to go to the

Remembrance service at the War memorial.

There was no way I was going to let Covid take away Remembrance Sunday, so I decided to have my own. I decided to do a display on my front lawn where I could pay my respects to all those who gave so much and would allow others to do the same.

One day I was on my drive and I spoke to a man who told me his father had been rescued from Dunkirk, but his uncle couldn't be brought back because he had been killed and never got to come home. So I decided to walk with a poppy wreath between the War Memorial in West End and the War Memorial in Bisley in April until I had covered 133 miles which is the distance from Dunkirk to the Cenotaph in London, as a way to feel like we have brought back all the brave souls who gave their lives.

The walk also helped to raise money for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal to help towards the vital work they do taking care of the members of our armed forces and their families, looking after the people who look after us.

Everyone was so kind and generous. The total raised was just under £3500. The incredible support I felt from everyone who beeped and waved when they spotted me was like being in a

poppy version of 'Where's Wally?', and to all the people who joined me on the walk even though it quickly became obvious that they were a lot fitter than I was.

I do feel that Rose Jeffery and Malcolm Vaughan were trying to kill me, even if I did manage to achieve a personal best on my times when they joined me.

It wasn't without its challenges, from getting snowed on and sunburnt in the same week, to getting stopped twice in the same day, once by the police and once by a villager and asked if I had just stolen a poppy wreath. I calmly explained what I was doing and refrained from saying "wasn't it lucky I had also been able to steal a Royal British Legion hat, T-shirt and pin badges as well and wouldn't I be the world's worst thief, as I had my name in large letters on my back".

On one of the days I suddenly spotted a sign showing where the nearest defibrillator was, and I hoped the sign had always been there and someone hadn't thought they had better put it out when they saw me walking about.

Lastly, I want to say a huge personal thank you to Norman Holden who supported me every step of the way, coming out nearly every day. Carrying the Royal British Legion Standard when some days it was so windy, I thought we both might end up in another county. All his help and advice when I realised, I didn't

> have the first clue about fund raising. Keeping me entertained with his incredible life stories and for becoming a great friend.

So preparations are now underway for this year's remembrance display and I will be selling poppies on my driveway on Saturday 13th November. Cathy Corner

- We have been able to accommodate, with appropriate Covid-protective measures, Almac Bisley Brass Band's Autumn Concert in September (see photos in the Band's article); the BRA's Annual General Meeting in October and a diverse range of parties and celebrations;
- In October St John the Baptist Church started holding monthly 'Messy Church' services in the Main Hall.
- The Community Café on Monday mornings, from 10 11.30 am continues to provide a much valued meeting place for a drink and a chat.

We continue to work on the Hall's structure and appearance. During the last few months, a leaking roof at the back of the premises was repaired and a lot of work has been carried out inside the Hall - most of it by (Saint) Michael Wand who devotes a great deal of his time to caring for the Hall. We have also improved indoor signage, renaming some of the rooms after people who have made valued contributions to Hall and village life, including Len Tamplin, Jim Henbest and Barry Wells.

Hear more at our AGM on Monday the 15th of November. We are hoping that it will be possible to hold this meeting at the Hall (like the BRA's AGM) rather than on Zoom. Further details will be published soon.

It looks like we could be even busier in the next few months. We're very happy about that!
