Barry Wells

Barry and Joan Wells were known by so many people in Bisley. It was very sad to hear that Barry passed away on 29th January 2021. Only his close family were able to attend his funeral due to COVID restrictions, but there will be a service in celebration of Barry's life at St. John the Baptist Church, Bisley for his friends to attend on Saturday 23rd April 2022 at 1.30pm where he will be interred.



Afterwards his family would love his friends to join them at Bisley Village Hall where there will be refreshments and a chance to say a final farewell. Those who may not be able to attend the church service can come straight to the hall for 2.15pm.

Barry was involved in many activities in the village community and beyond. He was Chairman of Bisley Village Hall 1983-1997, Chairman of the Village Youth Club, he organised the Bisley Bingo Club & Chiropody Clinic, he was instrumental in the setting up of the Bowls Club and was actively involved as a club member (he loved his bowls). He was involved in the setting up of the Day Centre, fundraising for the Day Centre Minibus and he was also the driver for many of the Day Centre outings. He cooked amazing Christmas dinners with Chris Brown at the Village Hall for over 100 people and he played the part of Father Christmas for both Parent & Toddlers and the Playgroup for many years.

He served as a Parish Councillor and was involved in the setting up of the allotments in Queens Road and a seat in memory of the Falklands War along the main road. Many children in the village had wooden toys made by Barry in his workshop. Signs and games were designed and made by Barry for the Strawberry Fayre that are still in use now. Barry was a member of the British Legion and Chairman of the Woking Branch of the RSPCA. So much to celebrate!

Bisley CofE School

Our children are absolutely loving Forest School!

We currently have a number of programmes running which mean all children get an opportunity to be involved. We have a number of adults in school who have completed the Forest School training and we are putting them to good use!

It all starts in Reception (age 4-5) where all children have one half term where they take part in Forest School every Thursday morning and Year 1 (age 5-6) have one half term where the children take part in Forest School on Thursday afternoon. Mrs Humphries takes the children through basic Forest School activities such as whittling, tree climbing, den building, plant recognition and the very popular, lighting a fire, making smores and hot chocolate!

New this year we have Forest Friday for children in Year 2 (age 6-7) through to Year 6 (age 10-11), which is where every class spends one full Friday every term at Forest School. They spend the whole day learning through Forest School and it has proved very popular! Mrs Stainforth leads the sessions and incorporates learning that has taken place in the classroom. The class teacher is present as well and it is a great opportunity for them to get stuck in with the children outside of the classroom. The majority of our sessions take place on site but recently Year 6 ventured up to Bisley common and had great fun exploring natural objects and all that the common has to offer.

We have also started to use Forest School as an intervention

(small group work) to help children develop their confidence and self-esteem. It has had brilliant results and



we have really seen children blossom and flourish from these sessions.

As well as all the practical skills learnt at Forest School the children learn character building skills such as resilience, self-determination, team work and learning to try something new. They learn how to risk assess a situation, such as checking how stable the branches are before climbing trees or ensuring the fire circle is being adhered to. Skills that are transferable and lifelong.

It really is such a great part of our curriculum and a firm favourite with everyone; including the staff who love taking part just as much as the children!

The last Arriva {DB - German Railways} 34,35, and 47 buses ran on 17 December 2021 after the company decided to give up

services based on their Guildford depot. Stagecoach buses have taken on the services, being based at Peasmarsh near Guildford with entirely different liveries. I use the plural because the company are currently changing to a new livery and as the replacement buses are drawn from elsewhere there is no one colour scheme

Nothing ever stays the same. While from the outside the Hall may look the same as ever, a lot has been happening behind the scenes. Most of it has been really positive. We have got through the pandemic without any serious

problems; most of our former regular users have returned and we have quite a lot of new ones. The Hall is used at weekends for a much wider range of celebrations and events than ever before; we have continued to improve the way the Hall looks and we have a fantastic redesigned website (www.bisleyvillagehall.org). The Community Café (see advert) is thriving and we are looking forward this year to holding the Strawberry Fayre on the Village Green for the first time since 2019.

Success has brought some challenges though. Before the pandemic, 9 organisations took most of the time available for hire. Now there are 25! Occasional weekend hire by ad hoc users has become frequent weekend hire. Additional bookings need processing and each of the ad hoc hirers (quite rightly) receives individual attention. We have adjusted the way we do things to cope with all of this and it has worked well. However, now our finance and bookings team faces a big change...

.....Cynthia Banton, our Treasurer for the last 5 years, is standing down in a few months' time. Cynthia - who joined us as a volunteer Trustee and Treasurer after retiring from accounting - has brilliantly steered our charitable trust's finances through the challenges of the pandemic and has managed a robust and effective financial regime. So we now find ourselves needing a new Treasurer. Please get in touch with me if you might be interested in joining our friendly and supportive team of Trustees and I'll tell you what's involved. It's great that we can plan to hold our **STRAWBERRY FAYRE** again, but the organisation of it is not easy. Our Strawberry Fayre Committee is busy sorting through the issues. WEBCare is back to normal with local, DBS checked volunteers providing practical short-term help 7 days a week for anyone needing transport, shopping, prescription collection or assistance with other small jobs. Call 07713 915393, (phone line open 10 -12noon Monday - Friday). Messages can be left via email (webcaregu24@gmail.com) to be actioned by the next Duty Officer on duty (minimum 48 hours' notice please). Please do not leave messages or text the WEBCare mobile.

We plan to hold our next AGM on Wednesday 11th May at the Bowls Club, West End; 12 noon for refreshments with the **AGM at 1 pm.** All welcome – come and learn more about what we do and how you could help. We have seen a big increase in the number of people using WEBCare's service and we really need new volunteers. Volunteers can do as much or as little as they like – there are no set times/dates for providing assistance and we now have a WhatsApp messaging system for matching volunteers with requests which is proving very effective.

Normal voluntary contributions (to cover DBS checks, insurance & volunteers' expenses) apply. Where transport is requested in connection with a Covid vaccination and/or assistance for those who still have to shield no voluntary contributions are requested. Volunteers may ask that masks are worn when providing transport. We can now provide transport for clients who need to use rollators or walking frames that need lifting & putting in a car boot (NB: if no volunteer is available contact Surrey Heath Community Transport: 01276 707 655 or NHS Transport: 0300 123 9840).
