Bisley Womens Institute - Happy 79th Birthday!

June has been a very busy month for our members. On Wednesday 6th June, three members attended the NFWI's annual Meeting in Cardiff as delegates. The resolution this year -"Mental Health matters" was accepted with a 98% majority. The WI aims to take action to make it as acceptable to talk about mental health issues as physical health issues, and to lobby government for better support for mental illness.

Bisley WI celebrated our 79th Birthday with a lovely cake and wonderful entertainment from Julie Beavan, who introduced us to the beautiful sounds of the Hammer Dulcimer. At our craft session we practised our skills of glass painting.

This year is the 100 year centenary of the Surrey Federation of WIs. There was an area celebration in Ripley, at which several Bisley members demonstrated a variety of old crafts - spinning, sewing, quilling and Dorset buttons. Others enjoyed tea and cakes and looking at the centenary books (in which each WI has created two pages relating to their history) and memorabilia from the Federation's archives. The story of the Hall is coming to life!

Earlier this year the Trustees of Bisley Village Hall launched a Heritage Project aimed at capturing the story of the Shaftesbury School and its impact on the village. Over the last few months the story has begun to come to life and there's more to come.

150 years ago 'the Refuge Farm School' opened in Bisley and 5 years later, in 1873, 'the Shaftesbury School' opened. The two Schools were amalgamated in 1919 to form the Bisley School. This closed in 1959. In 1962, Bisley Village Hall, the School's former chapel, opened

When we started our Heritage Project we wanted to uncover the stories behind these stark facts. It has become a fascinating, and rather daunting, venture during which we have acquired some remarkable material and heard some remarkable stories.

Following publicity about the Project we were contacted by a lot of people. They included those interested in the history; people who had lived in the village when the School was here; relatives and friends of former pupils and some former pupils. We received artefacts – including the lantern shown above – photographs and documents and we began to learn about what life was like when the School was here and in the early years of the Village Hall.

On 29th April the hall was packed with people who had come to hear from local historian Tim Price about the origins and history of the Hall, to see the displays and artefacts we now have and to share reminiscences and stories. They included a number of former pupils and relatives of pupils. Subsequently, in early June, we hosted an informal gathering of Bisley School Old Boys, over refreshments, at the Hall.

The story that is emerging is of a remarkable School, founded on Christian ethics that encouraged pupils – many of whom came from difficult social backgrounds - to be the best that they could be. The boys were not only homed, fed and clothed but also offered education and skills training and opportunities to help equip them for their futures. Bisley School had a big impact on individuals – whose stories are themselves remarkable - and on the village. And without it we wouldn't have the building that houses our Village Hall!

On Sunday 9th September, as part of the national Heritage Open Weekends, the Village Hall will be presented with a blue plaque to mark its part in the story. Look out for further details on our website, on Facebook and on local media.


