Bisley Village Hall Heritage Project.

Heritage Open Day and Blue Plaques.



Sunday 9 September was a proud day for Bisley Village Hall. With support from Surrey Heath Heritage Services the Hall took part in one of the country-wide Heritage Open Days and, during the day, **two blue plaques were unveiled: one to mark the fact that the present Hall was the Chapel of the original Bisley (Shaftesbury) Boys School, the other to commemorate the 114 Old Boys who lost their lives in two World Wars.**

The Open Day event marked a milestone for the Hall's Heritage Project. For the last few months the team of trustees running the Project have been collecting artefacts and memorabilia relating to the School and its chapel, which is now the Village Hall. They have made contact with former pupils, relatives of pupils and staff and other people who were in the Village before and after the School closed (1959) and



when the Village Hall opened (1962). They have listened to their stories and recorded some of them. They have worked with Shaftesbury Young People (the successor to the organisation that ran the Shaftesbury Homes) and a range of other people with interests in heritage issues.

All of this was evident on 9 September. The Open Day event was very well attended. It included displays, recordings, tours,

presentations, interviews with Bisley School Old Boys and refreshments provided by the WI. One of the Old Boys, Keith Mansfield, a former pupil who returned to be bandmaster in the 1950s, unveiled one of the blue plaques. Jim Henbest, honorary President of the Village Hall and lifelong villager) unveiled the other. The Mayor of Surrey Heath, Cllr Dan Adams was also involved in the ceremony. Six Old Boys were there and a number of relatives including the son of the last Headmaster of the School.

Many of those who were there were amazed, amused and moved by what they saw and heard. That's enormously encouraging for the team and the project will continue. But it can be quite hard work.
