#### Ken Atkins 1929-2019




With great sadness we received the news of the passing of Ken, a man who commanded immense affection and respect in Bisley and beyond. Ken was well


#### Bisley Heritage Project - we need your help!

**Update from Bisley Parish Council:** ◆ A new piece of all-inclusive play equipment (left picture) has been installed recently in the play space in Pilgrims Way/Clews Lane with safety matting beneath. It is hoped all children will enjoy the **new basket swing** for many years to come. ◆ A **height restriction barrier** has been installed at the entrance to the Village Hall Car park; keys are held by the Hall Trustees, the Scout and Guide HQ, the Parish Clerk and the Fire Brigade (centre picture). ◆ The Parish Council has taken on the responsibility from the County Highways for **the roundabout** and for **the planted areas** by the Post Office and the Hen and Chickens PH. The areas have either been replanted or turfed with bulbs planted. The Parish Council will also continue to maintain the area on a regular basis via its contractor Nigel Jeffries Landscapes Ltd, who carried out the original clearing and planting (right picture). #### Remembrance, Heritage and Memorial Windows

Following the award in September of two blue plaques Remembrance Sunday, 11th November 2018, saw a sizeable crowd, including a contingent of serving soldiers, gather outside the Hall after the annual service on the Green to witness Revd Andy Armitt bless the plaques. Inside, there was a special display relating to WW1, put together by Trustees and Tim Price, our local historian. This included material about the men whose names appear on the Village War Memorial and about the 'Old Boys' and staff associated with the Refuge Farm School and Shaftesbury School who gave their lives. We don't have any pictures of the event. If you do, please get in touch!

One of the plaques commemorates 89 Old Boys who died in WW1; After WW1 a later cohort of Old Boys built a sanctuary in memory of their predecessors incorporating Memorial Windows and a memorial tablet which disappeared when the School closed in 1959. We are raising funds to replace the existing shabby windows with ones that are similar to the originals (but more energy efficient!) and embarking on a new project to uncover the stories of the School, Chapel and the village around the time of WW1, so that future generations will be aware of the significance of what happened then. As

you will see from the separate insert we are looking for volunteers!
