Happy 80th Birthday to Bisley W.I.

This year Bisley WI celebrated its 80th Birthday. Their first meeting was in May 1939, just before World War II broke out in September. In the early records there are several references to Bisley WI's contribution to the war effort, which included providing billets for evacuees, knitting warm items for the forces, providing eggs and vegetables to local hospitals and hostels and, of course making jam.

At our June celebration meeting, memorabilia and photos from

our archives were on display. Liz Colvin (Bisley WI President) and Carol Gartrell (Surrey Federation of WIs Chairman) unveiled the new Bisley WI Presidents Board, listing all our presidents from 1939.

Members and guests were entertained by 'The Elderly Brothers' who performed



songs from the past which we were all able to join in with! This was followed by an excellent afternoon tea and a cake made by Fiona Jones and beautifully decorated by Iris Murdock (see above picture by Hester). It was a very enjoyable afternoon.


B.R.A Events

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Village Issues

The No. 34 Bus is 95 this year!

There are no records of buses serving Bisley before 1924 when both Woking & District and Aldershot & District buses started running between Woking and Bagshot. The number 34 was allocated to the Al-



dershot company's service which ran from Guildford via Mayford and had previously terminated at Knaphill Garibaldi.

In 1926 the service was extended to Camberley and subsequently to various locations within the general Camberley area.

In 1932 Woking & District was taken over by A and D- their service numbered 48a and ran from Weybridge to Camberley.

In 1928 the District Bus Service started running from Bracknell to Guildford via Bisley, it becoming the 62 when taken over by A and D in 1938, although cut back to start at Bagshot. It ceased as a wartime economy in 1939.

March 1954 saw a joint service between A&D and Thames Valley buses between Reading and Guildford via Bracknell and Bisley. This was the number 75 which lasted to the end of 1979. In 1970 we saw No. 29 buses going as far as Lightwater (previously only to Woking).


In January 1972 the Thames Valley and Aldershot bus companies combined, followed by numerous re-numberings and service alterations, culminating with 284s, 250s, 275s, 290s, just to confuse us! Added to this there were 376s (later 276s) from Guildford to Slough; 275s became 375s and then there was a 377.

In 1986 sanity returned and the 34 returned with Lightwater workings becoming 35s. To this day slightly modified 34s and 35s remain, although several changes of company ownership resulted in the current Arriva buses (Deutshe Bahn Railways of Berlin) taking over in 1996 and still giving us our service.

Oh, one last thing- don't forget to support the Commuter 47 buses peak hours between Brookwood (station) and West End or you will lose them!

▶ VILLAGE GREEN POND The work to dredge the pond has been completed and the area used for the deposit of the silt and debris has been cleared and reseeded. Thank you to the local residents for their patience when the weather did not allow us to complete the work as soon as we would have liked.


▶ CHURCH LANE SPEED REDUCTION The speed limit has been reduced on the approach to the village from the Warbury Lane direction from 40 mph to 30 mph with new gateway markers. The Parish Council contributed half of the cost of the scheme in order to get the speed reduction measures implemented to improve the safety of all users of Church Lane at this location.


